Guidelines for Redoing Work
<i>For the following Activities Only:</i>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quizzes (Labs) & Tests (Exams)
<i>Specific Information</i>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students are allowed to redo attempted assignment where a grade of 70% was not earned <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student responsibility to make arrangements with teacher • Redo's are for grades of 69 or less • Teacher shall allow a student one additional attempt to achieve a passing score of 70%. (Check IEP if applicable) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remediation shall be encouraged before a student is allowed to redo assignment/ test, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Good Faith (Student must try to complete assignment on first attempt)

(Make Up Due to Absence)

Guidelines for Making Up Work
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student responsibility to make arrangements with teacher • Student is given 1 day for every day absence – Regardless of Type of Absence
<i>Specific Information</i>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assignment turned in on time after absence – Opportunity to earn full credit • Assignment turned in 1 day late after scheduled due date – Opportunity to earn 70% • Assignment turned in 2 days late after absence – Student will earn 0% (Zero)
